


# HARDSCRABBLE RECREATION AREA MULTI-USE TRAILS

## PROTECT OUR PLAYGROUND

To enhance your experience and protect the area's natural resources, please use proper trail etiquette.

- Respect trail closures and allowed uses.
- Don't create new trails or move obstacles.
- Downhill travelers yield to uphill travelers.
- Alert others when passing from behind.
- Do not approach wildlife or livestock.
- Don't use muddy trails.
- Leave no trace.
- Follow all camping closures and signage.
- Use at your own risk.
- BLM trails are closed to motorized and mechanized travel from January 16 through April 15 for winter wildlife mitigation.
- Respect adjacent neighborhoods. Don't idle your vehicle and please keep pets on a leash.
- Please follow suggested directions.

## Motorized Users Required to Ride

- Operable brakes, muffler and USFS approved spark arrestor.
- Must be registered.
- After dark: headlight and taillight.
- Operators must be at least 10 years old or under immediate supervision of a licensed adult.
- Ride only on designated routes.
- Do not remove route designation or closure signs.
- Slow down and be prepared to stop when passing or meeting non-motorized users.

## RECOMMENDED RIDES FROM ROCKY MOUNTAIN SPORT RIDERS (RMSRCO.COM)


**Hardscrabble/Spring Creek (Gypsum/Eagle)**  
 These trails feature some of the easiest riding in the area, with a few challenging sections. Terrain is generally desert/gyp with sage and scrub oak. Parking is available at the Spring Creek trailhead, but no facilities.

**Green Gate (Gypsum/Basalt—area not shown on map)**  
 This trail system straddles the divide between Gypsum and Basalt on Cottonwood Pass, and consists of pine and aspen forests. Expect roots, rocks, large uphill, and tree crossings.

# DRY LAKE MOTOCROSS PARK



The only MX Park of its kind between Denver and Grand Junction, the Dry Lake MX Park is located 4.5 miles north of the Gypsum I70 exit #140, at 3730 Trail Gulch Road. The park is the result of a unique partnership between the Town of Gypsum, Eagle County, Colorado Parks & Wildlife and the Bureau of Land

Management, and is leased to Rocky Mountain Sport Riders to develop, manage and maintain the park. The 160-acre park currently offers Pee-Wee, Mini, Vet and Feature tracks, as well as an Endurocross and perimeter singletrack.

Dry Lake MX Park is open to the public from May through September. Users must register in advance and follow all posted rules and regulations.
